Congratulations on your decision to join a Navajo Cultural Arts BFA emphasis area! This opportunity to join the only Native American cultural arts BFA emphasis program in the country comes in recognition of your personal and professional endeavors. The following is the required process you will need to follow to become an enrolled Diné College student and to officially declare your major as BFA student.

## **Diné College Application Process**

Anticipating your start of the BFA course work, you will need to submit the following documents to the Office of Admissions (One Stop Shop, Student Union Building, Tsaile Campus):

- **Diné College Admissions Form**
  - Please go to the following website to complete the application form:

- **Admission Fee**
  - This \$20 fee can be paid at the Diné College Cashier's Office
- **Program Admission Form**
  - Program Admission Applications will be required for Bachelor's Degree seeking students.

- **Official Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB) or Enrollment Card**
  - This applies to individuals who are enrolled in a Federally Recognized Tribe.
- **Official Transcripts**
  - Official high school transcript with graduation date or high school equivalency credential (GED, HISET, or TASC) with test scores.
  - Official college/university transcripts for other accredited colleges/universities previously attended.

## **Enrollment Process**

After you have successfully submitted the aforementioned documents to the Office of Admissions, you will be invited back to campus to complete the following:

- **Campus Email Assignment**
  - The IT Department will assign you a Diné College email.
- **Placement Testing**
  - The Learning Center will give you a placement testing for English, Math and Reading areas.

## **Registration for Classes**

Once you have successfully submitted the required documents to the Office of Admissions, you will receive a Diné College Admissions letter with a Student ID. At that time, you will be welcomed to registered for your first semester of BFA classes. Advisors, including Dr. Christine Ami (NCAP Grant Manager), can help you navigate your degree checklist and course scheduling.

### **Degree Checklist**

Your degree checklist will correspond with your declared major: Navajo Weaving Emphasis Degree Checklist or Navajo Silversmithing Degree Checklist. Please schedule an appointment with advisors to ascertain what classes may transfer into this checklist and which classes you are eligible to register for this semester.

### **Orientation**

Classes commence August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019. An orientation is scheduled for the NCAP students that evening at 5:00pm. The NCAP staff will be in attendance to offer any additional assistance and to introduce you to other incoming and returning NCAP students.
